

### End of Reception Mathematics Targets

<u>Number:</u>	<u>Shape, Space and Measure:</u>
Children can count reliably with numbers from 1-20, place them in order and say which number is one more or one less.	Children can use everyday language to talk about size, weight, capacity, position, distance, time and money to compare quantities and objects and to solve problems.
Using quantities and objects, they add and subtract two single digit numbers and count on or back to find the answer.	They recognise, create and describe patterns.
They can solve problems, including doubling, halving and sharing.	They explore characteristics of everyday objects and shapes and use mathematical language to describe them.
